You will truly enjoy all that Sugar Pine Point State Park has to offer!

WINTER CAMPING

The park offers 25 campsites first-come, first-served, for winter overnight adventures. Centrally-heated restroom and water available. Though the parking area is plowed, the campsites are often covered with several feet of snow. Take advantage of this unique situation, and dig out the fire pit for a campfire or make a snow cave for a cozy sleeping experience. Winter camping in the Sierra takes special planning. Come prepared and leave with great memories!

CROSS-COUNTRY SKI TRAILS

Whether your passion is being on skis or snowshoes, the park offers an extensive winter trail system for both experienced and beginner winter enthusiasts. Five color-coded trails ranging from 1 to 3 miles in length. The trailhead for the Red and Blue Trails is located on the campground side of the park. The Yellow and Orange Trails depart from the day-use side of the park.

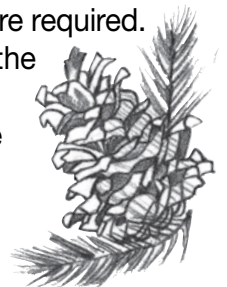
INTERPRETIVE PROGRAMS

Ranger-led winter interpretive programs are available throughout the winter months. Join us for our popular Full Moon Snowshoe hikes, a ski tour to the 1960 Olympic Biathlon site or one of the many other guided programs. Call the park Snow Phone for dates, times and topics.

NOTE: Programs are subject to weather and snow conditions.

PLEASE REMEMBER:

- Do not take dogs on the trails. Dogs are only allowed in the parking areas and must be on a leash no more than 6 feet in length.
- Do not walk on the ski trails. Walk and snowshoe to the sides of the trails.
- Day-use parking fees are required. Please self-register at the entrance stations.
- Be prepared for severe weather changes.
